



Notice of Amtrak Claims Fund Under the ADA



Amtrak has entered into a Settlement Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice to resolve a lawsuit brought under the Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA"). The Settlement Agreement resolves alleged violations of the ADA.

If you were harmed by Amtrak's lack of accessible transportation services between July 27, 2013 and December 2, 2020 you may be eligible to receive payment from a compensation fund established by Amtrak.

To be eligible for consideration for possible payment, you must submit a claim by May 29, 2021. You may obtain information on how to submit a claim in several ways: (1) by visiting AmtrakDisabilitySettlement.com, (2) by sending an email with your name, address, and telephone number to info@AmtrakDisabilitySettlement.com, or (3) by calling the Fund Administrator at (888) 334-6165 or TTY: (866) 411-6976.

A copy of the Settlement Agreement between the U.S. Department of Justice and Amtrak is available at AmtrakDisabilitySettlement.com. For further information about the ADA, visit www.ada.gov or call the Department of Justice's toll-free ADA Information Line at 1-800-514-0301 (voice) or 1-800-514-0383 (TTY).






Recreation Fund Scope

On December 10, 2019 I had a Suprapubic operation, because my bladder stopped functioning correctly. Over the past five months I have been having challenges with my "in line catheter", so I though I would share some things that may help any other person with the same problem.

Back in August of last year, my Urologist in Salem stopped working with the VA. That meant I could not have my catheter changed here in Salem. I was not informed of this, and was still going to them.

In November I started getting bills from my Salem Urologist, so I called them and found the billing department had no idea of what was going on. I was supposed to have a catheter change made in November, but I could not find a Urologist in the Salem area.

December came and I still had not had my catheter changed, so I started calling the VA to figure out what I was to do. They had me come into the VA in Portland.

Doing some more research I found out that I was to go to Hillsboro to have it done. I went in for the change, the person who changed it had me stay in my chair to have it done. I finally ended up going to the emergency room to be corrected.



I went back to Hillsboro for my next change, this time they had me get on the bed to partially lay back. Within a week I was back in the emergency room.

While at emergency room, I started having the same problem. A friend told me to think for myself, so I figured out what the problem was. I decided to lay down and insert the catheter tube myself. I have not had a problem since. The StatLock device needed to be positioned closer so as not to strech the catheter.



I share this story with you, so that you will understand that we, the members of the Board of Directors, and other members assisting with the programs are doing all we can to support you.



We still have our own challenges. We are here for you, and will do all we can. We have found a great love of serving, but we need help. If you or, anyone you know feels like your challenges are hard, look outside of yourself and help others. We can use volunteers at the different events we put on. We need the world to know who we are, that we are serving each other.

We have opportunities to serve throughout the State of Oregon and Idaho. You are welcome to call the office (503-362-7998) to sign up. Even if you come to show the public you support us, that would be fantastic.



The weather has turned for the better and it is time for us wheelchair users to spread our wings. I was hesitant to travel during these challenging times, but an event came up that I just couldn't pass up.

The PVA sponsored a semi-annual hand cycling event at Pocahontas State Park in Chesterfield County, Virginia. Jody Shiflett and all his crew put on a great event at a wonderful location. Jennifer and I were surprised that we were to be using powered assisted handcycles rather than the traditional solely human powered. These machines are awesome! State of the art mechanisms and pretty new machines were provided to dozens of veterans. The gearing is hand switched and 8 speeds were available on my craft. Boy did we fly! The park is just 20 miles from Richmond and has over 90 miles of trails for all skill levels.

Although it was cold in the mornings, the sun blessed us all through the day. Jody took us all over the park where we explored many trails. We went up and down hills all day with occasional photo stops. The staff provided yummy lunches and a warm fire. I was the furthest traveler that day, but there were vets from all over in attendance.



The scenery of nature is worthy of the time to explore. Your cycle will be adjusted to your specific needs. We were given the chance to test out our vehicle before hitting the trails.



It was a rush to go downhill at speed and make hairpin turns and round corners, then cross water and mud bogs. It was just shy of downhill mayhem!

After the event, Jennifer and I explored the rest of the park which included 225 acre Swift Creek Lake and the Swift Creek Dam.

We also visited nearby Henricus Historical Park and the Dutch Gap Conservation Area. This area is rich in civil war history. The battlefields along the James River are in addition to the Indian and settlers history that is so unique to this region. We burned out our phones taking so many pictures.

This cycling event is held two times a year. It may be a long trip for us here at the Oregon Chapter, but I highly recommend giving it a try. The people of Virginia were great hosts and very COVID compliant throughout our visit. It definitely made us feel safe and welcomed. This is another great reason to access your recreation fund.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

We are working with stakeholder groups to get their input on ways we can best provide this assistance, and to enlist their help with outreach to families and communities. FEMA will begin to implement COVID-19 funeral assistance in April.

Additional guidance is being finalized and will be released to potential applicants and community partners as soon as possible. In the meantime, people who have COVID-19 funeral expenses are encouraged to keep and gather documentation.

Who is Eligible?

To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, noncitizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.

• There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

How to Apply

In April, FEMA will begin accepting applications. If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include:

- An official death certificate that attributes
 the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19
 and shows that the death occurred in the
 United States, including the U.S. territories,
 and the District of Columbia.
- Funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened.
- Proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.

How are Funds Received

If you are eligible for funeral assistance you will receive a check by mail, or funds by direct deposit, depending on which option you choose when you apply for assistance.



HVAC, SUBCOMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY HOLDS LEGISLATIVE HEARING

On April 14, the House Veterans' Affairs Committee. Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity held a hearing on 16 pieces of legislation. Maureen Elias, Associate Legislative Director, testified on behalf of PVA. The main focus of PVA's testimony was a draft bill that would provide a new automobile allowance for eligible serviceconnected veterans every ten years, as well as provide a small grant for eligible veterans enrolled in VA health care with non-serviceconnected qualifying conditions to purchase an adapted vehicle. The auto grant provision in the draft bill related to service-connected veterans mirrors the language in the AUTO for Veterans Act (H.R. 1361/S. 444), which is a top priority for PVA. The draft bill would also place into statute the provision of ingress/egress by VA for non-serviceconnected veterans enrolled in VA health care and open eligibility for these veterans to the adaptations available through the Automotive Adaptive Equipment program. Other bills focused on improvements to benefits for homeless veterans; fixes to VA education services, including codifying some protections that were put in place during COVID for future disasters: removal of

delimiting dates and a requirement for instate tuition for those using Chapter 35 benefits, as well as protections overseeing implementation of the "Digital GI Bill;" and establishment of a fourth VA Administration to handle the economic opportunity benefits currently under the purview of the Veterans Benefits Administration. BIDEN-HARRIS ADMINISTRATION RELEASES FISCAL YEAR 2022 BUDGET OUTLINE

On April 9, the Biden-Harris Administration released a budget outline for Fiscal Year 2022. The outline does not include all the details and specifics traditionally found in the president's annual budget proposal to Congress. White House officials say a more comprehensive document will be released in the coming weeks. In the meantime, the outline gives lawmakers the top line numbers for federal agencies to allow them to start preparing the 12 annual funding bills.

Here is a snapshot of some of the funding being proposed for VA:

Provides \$113.1 billion in total discretionary spending for VA, \$97.5 billion of which would go toward VA

- health care, an increase of \$7.6 billion from 2021. \$94 billion of this amount is already approved through advance appropriations.
- Calls for \$882 million for medical and prosthetic research, the largest amount in history, which is very close to the Independent Budget's recommendation of \$902 million.
- Provides \$40.3 million so VA can hire additional claims processors to handle veteran disability claims which became backlogged during the pandemic as well as the thousands of new claims expected from Vietnam War-era veterans who recently became eligible for benefits from Agent Orange-related conditions.
- Furnishes another \$4.8 billion to modernize VA IT systems and \$2.7 billion more for VA's electronic health record modernization project.

The request also contains increases for numerous programs important to people with disabilities:

- As part of the President's Equity Agenda, the Administration proposes significant increases for federal agencies' Offices of Civil Rights, and includes \$33 million in additional funds to the Department of Justice's Civil Rights Division and \$85 million more for state and local fair housing organizations to combat discrimination.
- An additional 200,000 families would receive aid with a \$30.4 billion infusion into the Housing Choice Voucher The program. budget provides increase of \$500 million in support of the HOME Investment Partnership Program to construct and rehabilitate affordable rental housing and \$180 million to the Department of Housing and Urban Development's elderly and disabled housing program would support an additional 2000 units.
- To expand opportunities for retraining and workforce development, the budget increases support for the Registered

- Apprenticeship system by \$100 million to a level of \$285 million; includes a six percent increase of \$3.7 billion for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act state grant programs to enhance career opportunities for disadvantaged groups, including low-income veterans; and contains a request of \$20 million for a new program, developed in collaboration with VA, focused on helping veterans shift to careers in clean energy.
- The request builds on the American Rescue Plan with an additional \$551 million for Home and Community Based Services, doubles funding for the Lifespan Respite Care Program, and provides additional resources for programs under the Administration for Community Living within the Department of Health and Human Services.
- The Social Security Administration's administrative budget would increase by \$1.3 billion to provide better field office services, add staff to help process disability claims, and lower customer service wait times.

STIMULUS PAYMENTS TO NON-FILERS BEGIN

In an announcement on March 30, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) said that stimulus payments to non-filer Social Security and other federal beneficiaries would be disbursed at the beginning of April with the projection that the majority of these payments would be sent electronically and received on April 7. The IRS continues to review data received for VA benefit recipients and expects to determine a payment date and provide more details soon. Currently, the IRS estimates that Economic Impact Payments for VA beneficiaries who do not regularly file tax returns could be disbursed by mid-April. VA beneficiary payment information will be available in the Get My Payment tool at a future date. Taxpayers should note that the form of payment for the third Economic Impact Payment, including for some Social

Security and other federal beneficiaries, may be different than earlier stimulus payments. More people are receiving direct deposits, while those receiving payments in the mail may receive either a paper check or an EIP Card – which may be different than how they received their previous Economic Impact Payments. Details about the stimulus payments can be found on the IRS website.

SOCIAL SECURITY EXPANSION UPDATE

Supporters of legislation to improve Social Security benefits have been waiting impatiently for reintroduction of measures such as the Social Security 2100 Act and the Stop the Wait Act. The former bill has been championed in previous Congresses by the Chairman of the Ways and Means Social Security Subcommittee, Rep. John Larson (D-CT), and contains a host of benefit enhancements and provisions to shore up Social Security trust fund finances well into this century. The latter bill is authored by Rep. Lloyd Doggett, (D-TX) and seeks to lessen the economic burden on those who qualify for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) by reducing or eliminating waiting periods for disability benefits and Medicare coverage. While both sponsors intend to pursue their legislation during this Congress, a number of factors have contributed to the delay.

When the 117th Congress convened in January, the urgent need to address the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic meant that legislators' attention was almost exclusively focused on the American Rescue Plan. In addition, the Biden-Harris Administration entered office with its own ideas about programs such as Medicare and Social Security that the President had outlined in his 2020 campaign platform. As a consequence, negotiations are underway between the Hill and the Administration to hammer out a new Social Security 2100 Act that reflects a consensus between congressional and White

House advocates. Once the agreed upon legislation is introduced, Chairman Larson plans on an extensive hearing schedule to highlight the importance of action on Social Security to address the nation's looming retirement crisis and the economic security needs of women and minority populations.

Rep. Doggett's bill, the Stop the Wait Act, is reportedly in its final drafting stages. While the new measure is expected to contain provisions eliminating the five-month waiting period for SSDI, some adjustments may be made to the Medicare sections to address cost concerns. Under discussion is a reduction in the 24-month wait for Medicare coverage for those granted SSDI to a 12-month waiting period.

"ROUNDING OUT" COMPROMISE **REACHED**

Under the GI Bill "rounding out" rule, students can round out their college schedule with non-required classes to make their course load full-time once per program, allowing them to continue to receive fulltime benefits. VA planned to phase out the rule on August 1, but a compromise reached between the Department, Congress, and veterans service organizations will allow the practice to continue if students are taking classes that are part of their program of education. The following example illustrates how this applies:

A student enrolled in a program to obtain a BA in Political Science must take two courses in governments (e.g., governments of Europe, Africa, South America, or Asia) as a graduation requirement. The university offers four courses that can meet the requirement. The student took two courses and therefore does not need a third or fourth for graduation. However, if the student wants to round out, VA will support the

GI Bill student in taking a third or fourth course because the course is included in the student's program of education, even though taking the additional course(s) is not a "graduation requirement."

PVA is pleased with the compromise which allows VA to support enhanced benefits for eligible GI Bill students while protecting them from unnecessarily using their earned GI Bill entitlement by taking unrelated courses.

NEWS ITEMS OF NOTE

National Disability Institute (NDI)
 Publishes Paper on Costs of Living with
 a Disability

NDI recently released a paper examining the costs of living with a disability. Researchers estimate that households containing an adult with a work-disability require, on average, 28 percent more income (or an additional \$17,690 a year for a household at the median income level) to obtain the same standard of living as a comparable household without a member with a disability.

 Disability Rights Film "Crip Camp" Nominated for an Oscar

Crip Camp chronicles the experiences of a group of young people with disabilities at a summer camp in upstate New York during the 1950s and 1960s who would become leaders in the disability rights movement of the 1970s. Among those profiled is Judy Heumann, State Department Special Advisor for Disability Rights in the Obama Administration and Assistant Secretary of Education under President Clinton. The film features her role in the sit-in at the regional office of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to compel the Carter Administration to implement the 1973 Rehabilitation Act. 
